COMMITTEE REPORT

SUBMITTED BY : THE COMMITTEE ON LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

SUBJECT : Letter from the Honorable City Mayor, Eduardo B. Dimacuha dated October 1, 2015 endorsing the Annual Investment Plan of the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council as of CY 2016.

COMMENTS:

On October 5, 2015, the Sangguniang Panlungsod referred to the Committee on Laws, Rules and Regulations the above letter for study, comment and recommendation.

Section 12, Letter C (7) of R.A. 10121 ("Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010") and Rule 6, Section 4 (8) of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of R.A. 10121, provide that the CDRRM shall "Prepare and submit to the local sanggunian through the LDRRMC and the LDC the annual LDRRMO Plan and Budget, the proposed programming, resources, funding sources and budgetary support". What is required by the aforementioned law and its IRR is merely the submission of the annual LDRRMO Plan and Budget to the Sanggunian. Hence, the CDRRMO has already complied the mandates of R.A. 10121.

RECOMMENDATION:

Finding the proposed CDRRMC Annual Investment Plan in accordance with law and responsive to the needs of Batangas City in terms of disaster risk reduction / protection, the Committee recommends:

2. The approval of the required Resolution hereto attached.
